Vision

The vision for the nursery was set by our founders in 1985. They understood 3 decades ago the importance of saving our native wildflowers and acquired the site with an aim of growing plants to improve species presence for our county. Today we are a respected plant and tree nursery furthering their ambitions across Yorkshire and Lincolnshire.

The beginning was a family affair including a daughter with a learning disability who grew up alongside the horticultural and green site development. Understanding the therapeutic benefit of working in nature the founders set up the charity to involve other vulnerable people in society, enabling them to learn about horticulture at the site in North Cave.

30 years on we continue to honour this vision with a broad horticultural operation, offering over 90 people a week the opportunity to attend the established nursery.



Purpose

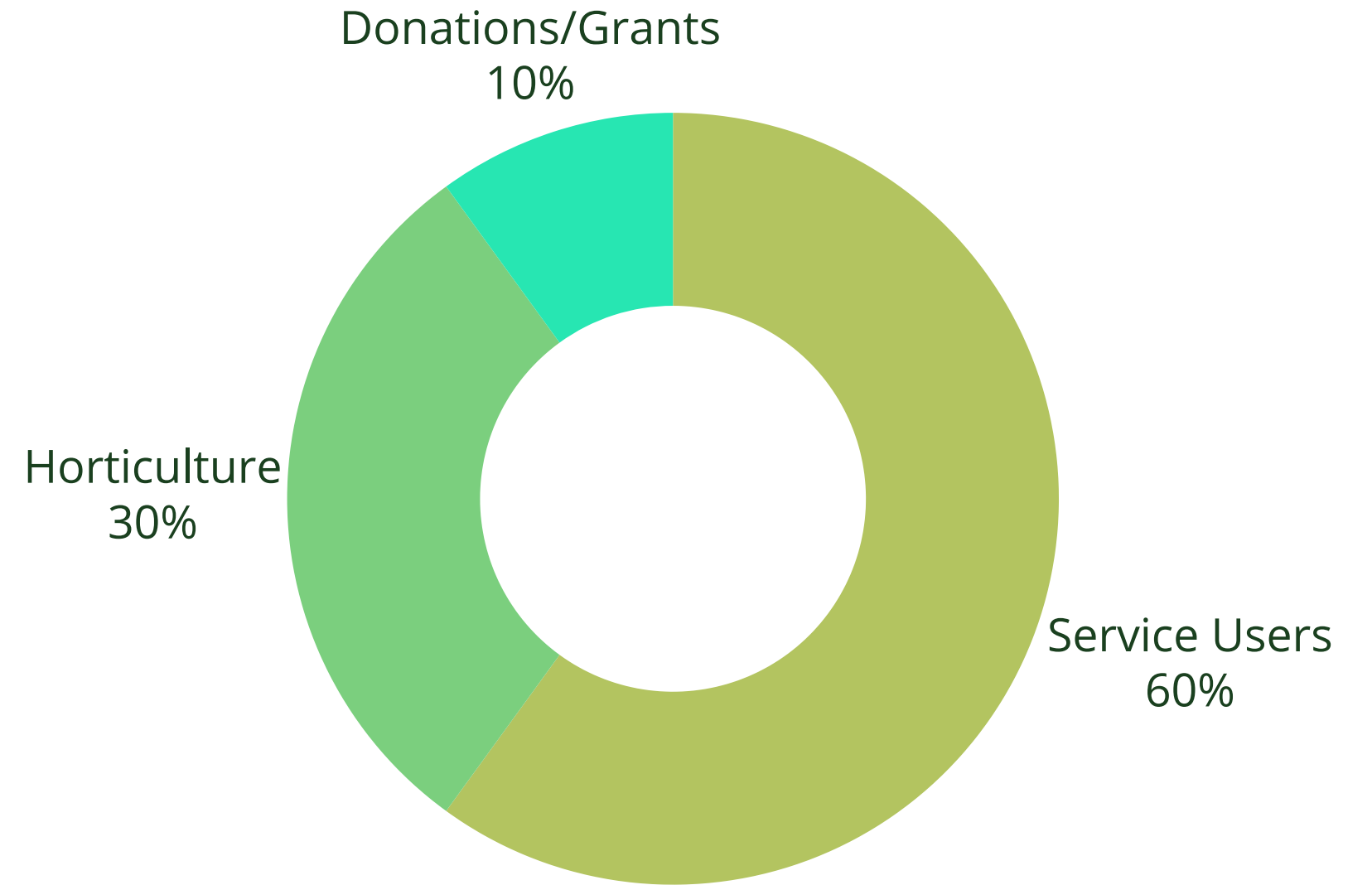
We have 3 main aims:

Values

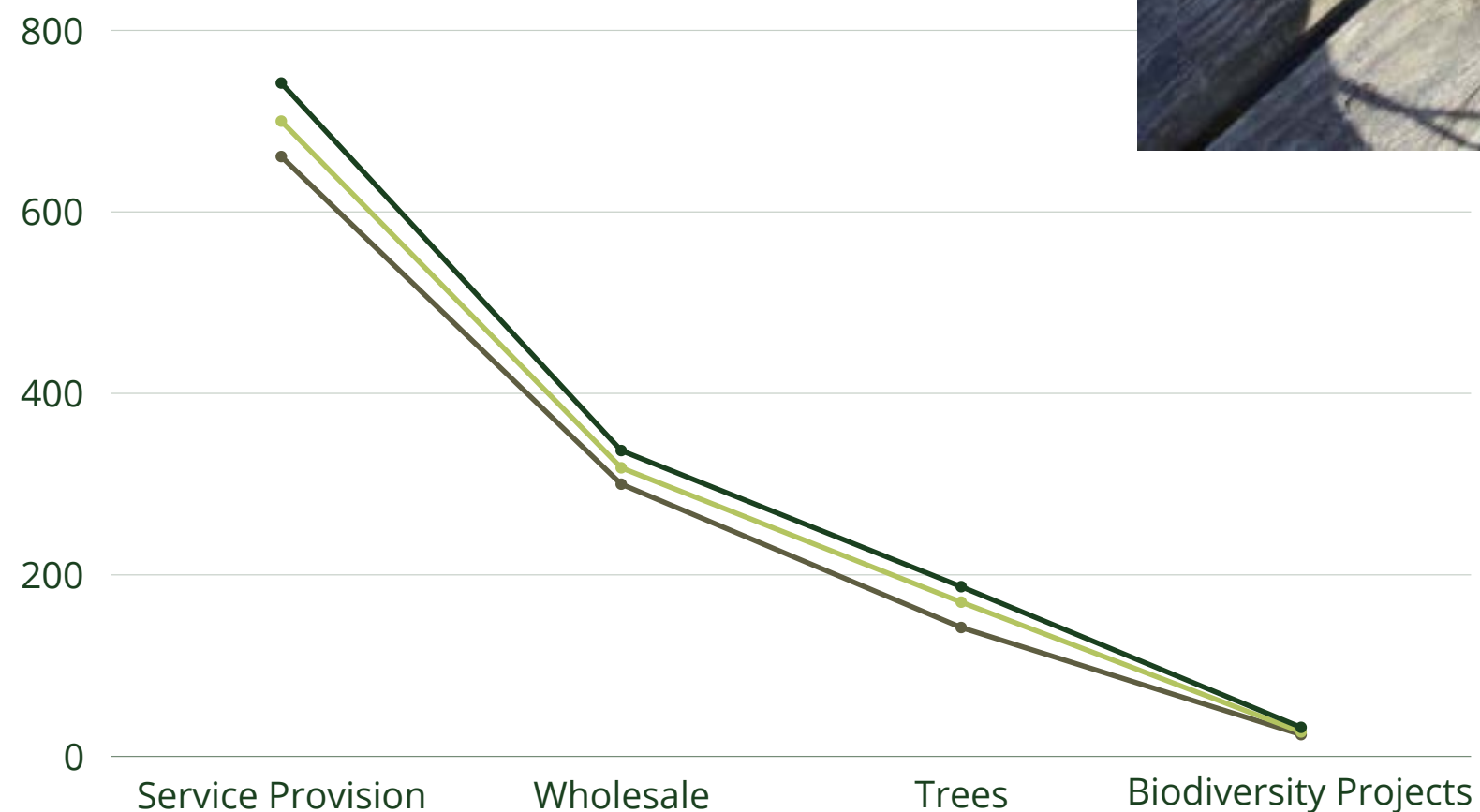

Strategic Overview

The service has a management structure to deliver on the growth targets for the main charitable activities, plant and tree production and management of the facility repairs and renewals.

All operations represent a full year programme of activities for our clients.



We are working to improve quality across day care provision and the facility itself. The cost of maintaining and upgrading the nursery is significant and we continue to improve awareness of the charity through furthering our commercial connections and improving our marketing reach. We have invested in training to enable us to improve the staff knowledge base and grow our expertise, and offer new operational learning for students transitioning from schools to adult services. Our plant business is following health regulations assuring our customers of their consistent quality.

Our Service Users

- Local Authority referrals of adults within the social services sector with Learning Disabilities and Autism.
- Self-referral clients who are not funded by the Local Authority but are recommended to our facility.
- School leavers who access the nursery for horticulture education prior to leaving school at 18 through a Transition programme.
- Elderly visitors who access Mires Beck through a designed horticulture and craft-based programme.
- Schools who use our outdoor learning classroom and woodland to offer children emersion into nature in a safe space.
- Community beneficiaries on funded projects such as 'Green Social Prescribing'.

Our Plants



Herbaceous Perennials

We grow around 70,000 plants per year for onsite retail and wholesale supplying trade and heritage retail.



Cell Grown Trees

Since 2020, over 26 varieties of British species cell-grown trees are produced to a large volume of 350,000 per year for DEFRA funded and community planting projects.



Wildflowers of Yorkshire Provenance

Today we have a seed library of 150 species and grow to contract for conservation orders. We also supply, wholesale and onsite retail.



Herbs

Over 55 varieties are grown largely for onsite retail, but in 2023 we commenced supply to the National Trust and garden centres in the region.
